



BEARFACTS 1993 – 2003

Broomfield , Colorado [08014]

Broomfield[†] is one of 64 counties in Colorado. It is part of the [Denver-Aurora, CO \(MSA\)](#). Its 2003 population of 45,181 ranked 16th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2003 Broomfield had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$30,944. This PCPI ranked 17th in the state and was 91 percent of the state average, \$33,989, and 98 percent of the national average, \$31,504. The 2003 PCPI reflected a decrease of 3.0 percent from 2002. The 2002-2003 state change was 0.1 percent and the national change was 2.2 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2003 Broomfield had a total personal income (TPI) of \$1,398,065*. This TPI ranked 13th in the state and accounted for 0.9 percent of the state total. The 2003 TPI reflected an increase of 2.9 percent from 2002. The 2002-2003 state change was 1.2 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Broomfield. In 2003 net earnings accounted for 76.0 percent of TPI; dividends, interest, and rent were 15.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts were 8.3 percent. From 2002 to 2003 net earnings increased 4.4 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 7.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 9.9 percent. From 1993 to 2003 net earnings cannot be calculated; the growth rate for dividends, interest, and rent cannot be calculated; the growth rate for personal current transfer receipts cannot be calculated.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Broomfield increased from \$1,695,772* in 2002 to \$1,769,410* in 2003, an increase of 4.3 percent. The 2002-2003 state change was 1.3 percent and the national change was 3.8 percent.
