



BEARFACTS 1994 – 2004

Alaska [02000]

The population of Alaska in 2004 was 661,661. Its rank was 47th in the nation.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2004 Alaska had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$33,906. This PCPI ranked 17th in the United States and was 102 percent of the national average, \$33,123. The 2004 PCPI reflected an increase of 4.2 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 national change was 5.1 percent. In 1994 the PCPI of Alaska was \$25,050 and ranked 6th in the United States. The 1994-2004 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.1 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2004 Alaska had a total personal income (TPI) of \$22,434,335*. This TPI ranked 47th in the United States. In 1994 the TPI of Alaska was \$15,112,637* and ranked 46th in the United States. The 2004 TPI reflected an increase of 5.9 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 national change was 6.1 percent. The 1994-2004 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.2 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Alaska. In 2004 net earnings accounted for 71.7 percent of TPI (compared with 71.2 in 1994); dividends, interest, and rent were 13.9 percent (compared with 16.5 in 1994); and personal current transfer receipts were 14.4 percent (compared with 12.3 in 1994). From 2003 to 2004 net earnings increased 7.8 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 4.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts decreased 1.8 percent. From 1994 to 2004 net earnings increased on average 4.1 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.7 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Alaska increased from \$17,707,194* in 2003 to \$19,049,267* in 2004, an increase of 7.6 percent. The 2003-2004 national change was 6.5 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1994 estimate of \$12,886,357* to the 2004 estimate was 4.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.5 percent.
