



BEARFACTS 1994 – 2004

Broomfield , Colorado [08014]

Broomfield[†] is one of 64 counties in Colorado. It is part of the [Denver-Aurora, CO \(MSA\)](#). Its 2004 population of 46,664 ranked 16th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2004 Broomfield had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$31,293. This PCPI ranked 20th in the state and was 88 percent of the state average, \$35,523, and 94 percent of the national average, \$33,123. The 2004 PCPI reflected an increase of 1.1 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 state change was 4.5 percent and the national change was 5.1 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2004 Broomfield had a total personal income (TPI) of \$1,460,263*. This TPI ranked 14th in the state and accounted for 0.9 percent of the state total. The 2004 TPI reflected an increase of 4.4 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 state change was 5.8 percent and the national change was 6.1 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Broomfield. In 2004 net earnings accounted for 78.5 percent of TPI; dividends, interest, and rent were 13.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts were 8.0 percent. From 2003 to 2004 net earnings increased 7.9 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 10.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 1.2 percent. From 1994 to 2004 net earnings cannot be calculated; the growth rate for dividends, interest, and rent cannot be calculated; the growth rate for personal current transfer receipts cannot be calculated.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Broomfield increased from \$1,769,410* in 2003 to \$1,940,548* in 2004, an increase of 9.7 percent. The 2003-2004 state change was 6.3 percent and the national change was 6.5 percent.
