



BEARFACTS 1994 – 2004

Bath , Kentucky [21011]

Bath is one of 120 counties in Kentucky. It is part of the Mount Sterling, KY Micropolitan SA. Its 2004 population of 11,468 ranked 95th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2004 Bath had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$19,586. This PCPI ranked 83rd in the state and was 72 percent of the state average, \$27,017, and 59 percent of the national average, \$33,123. The 2004 PCPI reflected an increase of 2.7 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 state change was 4.5 percent and the national change was 5.1 percent. In 1994 the PCPI of Bath was \$12,995 and ranked 92nd in the state. The 1994-2004 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.0 percent and for the nation was 4.1 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2004 Bath had a total personal income (TPI) of \$224,616*. This TPI ranked 96th in the state and accounted for 0.2 percent of the state total. In 1994 the TPI of Bath was \$130,807* and ranked 103rd in the state. The 2004 TPI reflected an increase of 3.0 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 state change was 5.2 percent and the national change was 6.1 percent. The 1994-2004 average annual growth rate of TPI was 5.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Bath. In 2004 net earnings accounted for 61.7 percent of TPI (compared with 60.4 in 1994); dividends, interest, and rent were 9.8 percent (compared with 13.3 in 1994); and personal current transfer receipts were 28.4 percent (compared with 26.2 in 1994). From 2003 to 2004 net earnings increased 2.3 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 10.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 10.4 percent. From 1994 to 2004 net earnings increased on average 5.8 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.4 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Bath increased from \$67,155* in 2003 to \$69,103* in 2004, an increase of 2.9 percent. The 2003-2004 state change was 5.7 percent and the national change was 6.5 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1994 estimate of \$54,117* to the 2004 estimate was 2.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.9 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
