



BEARFACTS 1994 – 2004

Young , Texas [48503]

Young is one of 254 counties in Texas. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2004 population of 17,699 ranked 128th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2004 Young had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$27,474. This PCPI ranked 69th in the state and was 89 percent of the state average, \$30,989, and 83 percent of the national average, \$33,157. The 2004 PCPI reflected an increase of 6.0 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 state change was 5.3 percent and the national change was 5.2 percent. In 1994 the PCPI of Young was \$18,499 and ranked 67th in the state. The 1994-2004 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.4 percent and for the nation was 4.1 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2004 Young had a total personal income (TPI) of \$486,266*. This TPI ranked 115th in the state and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total. In 1994 the TPI of Young was \$328,843* and ranked 113th in the state. The 2004 TPI reflected an increase of 5.8 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 state change was 7.0 percent and the national change was 6.1 percent. The 1994-2004 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.4 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Young. In 2004 net earnings accounted for 59.1 percent of TPI (compared with 55.6 in 1994); dividends, interest, and rent were 17.8 percent (compared with 22.7 in 1994); and personal current transfer receipts were 23.1 percent (compared with 21.6 in 1994). From 2003 to 2004 net earnings increased 11.1 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 7.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 4.1 percent. From 1994 to 2004 net earnings increased on average 4.6 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 1.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.6 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Young increased from \$282,085* in 2003 to \$314,031* in 2004, an increase of 11.3 percent. The 2003-2004 state change was 7.9 percent and the national change was 6.5 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1994 estimate of \$202,082* to the 2004 estimate was 4.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.8 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
