



BEARFACTS 1994 – 2004

Beaver , Utah [49001]

Beaver is one of 29 counties in Utah. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2004 population of 6,000 ranked 24th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2004 Beaver had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$27,420. This PCPI ranked 3rd in the state and was 105 percent of the state average, \$26,053, and 83 percent of the national average, \$33,157. The 2004 PCPI reflected an increase of 18.9 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 state change was 4.4 percent and the national change was 5.2 percent. In 1994 the PCPI of Beaver was \$13,872 and ranked 23rd in the state. The 1994-2004 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 7.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.0 percent and for the nation was 4.1 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2004 Beaver had a total personal income (TPI) of \$164,520*. This TPI ranked 23rd in the state and accounted for 0.3 percent of the state total. In 1994 the TPI of Beaver was \$71,565* and ranked 24th in the state. The 2004 TPI reflected an increase of 18.9 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 state change was 7.0 percent and the national change was 6.1 percent. The 1994-2004 average annual growth rate of TPI was 8.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.3 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Beaver. In 2004 net earnings accounted for 74.3 percent of TPI (compared with 57.8 in 1994); dividends, interest, and rent were 9.8 percent (compared with 19.1 in 1994); and personal current transfer receipts were 15.9 percent (compared with 23.2 in 1994). From 2003 to 2004 net earnings increased 27.3 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 2.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 1.6 percent. From 1994 to 2004 net earnings increased on average 11.4 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 1.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.6 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Beaver increased from \$103,905* in 2003 to \$130,620* in 2004, an increase of 25.7 percent. The 2003-2004 state change was 7.7 percent and the national change was 6.5 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1994 estimate of \$49,661* to the 2004 estimate was 10.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.5 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
