



BEARFACTS 1994 – 2004

Teton , Wyoming [56039]

Teton is one of 23 counties in Wyoming. It is part of the Jackson, WY-ID Micropolitan SA. Its 2004 population of 19,184 ranked 10th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2004 Teton had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$89,413. This PCPI ranked 1st in the state and was 253 percent of the state average, \$35,314, and 270 percent of the national average, \$33,157. The 2004 PCPI reflected an increase of 13.7 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 state change was 7.3 percent and the national change was 5.2 percent. In 1994 the PCPI of Teton was \$42,719 and ranked 1st in the state. The 1994-2004 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 7.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.6 percent and for the nation was 4.1 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2004 Teton had a total personal income (TPI) of \$1,715,303*. This TPI ranked 3rd in the state and accounted for 9.7 percent of the state total. In 1994 the TPI of Teton was \$611,734* and ranked 5th in the state. The 2004 TPI reflected an increase of 15.7 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 state change was 8.1 percent and the national change was 6.1 percent. The 1994-2004 average annual growth rate of TPI was 10.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.1 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Teton. In 2004 net earnings accounted for 41.7 percent of TPI (compared with 55.0 in 1994); dividends, interest, and rent were 55.3 percent (compared with 41.0 in 1994); and personal current transfer receipts were 3.0 percent (compared with 4.0 in 1994). From 2003 to 2004 net earnings increased 5.8 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 25.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 2.3 percent. From 1994 to 2004 net earnings increased on average 7.8 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 14.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 7.7 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Teton increased from \$843,479* in 2003 to \$886,164* in 2004, an increase of 5.1 percent. The 2003-2004 state change was 8.4 percent and the national change was 6.5 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1994 estimate of \$414,408* to the 2004 estimate was 7.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.6 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
