



BEARFACTS 1995 – 2005 Summit , Colorado [08117]

Summit is one of 64 counties in Colorado. It is part of the Silverthorne, CO Micropolitan SA. Its 2005 population of 25,344 ranked 20th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2005 Summit had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$37,461. This PCPI ranked 12th in the state and was 100 percent of the state average, \$37,611, and 108 percent of the national average, \$34,690. The 2005 PCPI reflected an increase of 6.1 percent from 2004. The 2004-2005 state change was 5.7 percent and the national change was 4.6 percent. In 1995 the PCPI of Summit was \$26,380 and ranked 8th in the state. The 1995-2005 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.5 percent and for the nation was 4.2 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2005 Summit had a total personal income (TPI) of \$949,411*. This TPI ranked 19th in the state and accounted for 0.5 percent of the state total. In 1995 the TPI of Summit was \$497,877* and ranked 18th in the state. The 2005 TPI reflected an increase of 6.7 percent from 2004. The 2004-2005 state change was 7.1 percent and the national change was 5.6 percent. The 1995-2005 average annual growth rate of TPI was 6.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.6 percent and for the nation was 5.3 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Summit. In 2005 net earnings accounted for 67.0 percent of TPI (compared with 75.0 in 1995); dividends, interest, and rent were 28.5 percent (compared with 21.8 in 1995); and personal current transfer receipts were 4.5 percent (compared with 3.2 in 1995). From 2004 to 2005 net earnings increased 5.6 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 8.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 10.4 percent. From 1995 to 2005 net earnings increased on average 5.5 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 9.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 10.3 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Summit increased from \$730,778* in 2004 to \$771,254* in 2005, an increase of 5.5 percent. The 2004-2005 state change was 6.5 percent and the national change was 5.3 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1995 estimate of \$450,389* to the 2005 estimate was 5.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.0 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
