



## **BEARFACTS 1995 – 2005**

### **Canyon , Idaho [16027]**

Canyon is one of 44 counties in Idaho. It is part of the [Boise City-Nampa, ID \(MSA\)](#). Its 2005 population of 163,239 ranked 2nd in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2005 Canyon had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$20,631. This PCPI ranked 39th in the state and was 72 percent of the state average, \$28,681, and 59 percent of the national average, \$34,690. The 2005 PCPI reflected an increase of 4.8 percent from 2004. The 2004-2005 state change was 4.7 percent and the national change was 4.6 percent. In 1995 the PCPI of Canyon was \$16,467 and ranked 23rd in the state. The 1995-2005 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 2.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.0 percent and for the nation was 4.2 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2005 Canyon had a total personal income (TPI) of \$3,367,746\*. This TPI ranked 3rd in the state and accounted for 8.2 percent of the state total. In 1995 the TPI of Canyon was \$1,810,946\* and ranked 2nd in the state. The 2005 TPI reflected an increase of 9.3 percent from 2004. The 2004-2005 state change was 7.3 percent and the national change was 5.6 percent. The 1995-2005 average annual growth rate of TPI was 6.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.0 percent and for the nation was 5.3 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Canyon. In 2005 net earnings accounted for 65.8 percent of TPI (compared with 67.1 in 1995); dividends, interest, and rent were 13.7 percent (compared with 16.2 in 1995); and personal current transfer receipts were 20.5 percent (compared with 16.7 in 1995). From 2004 to 2005 net earnings increased 8.6 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 10.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 10.5 percent. From 1995 to 2005 net earnings increased on average 6.2 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 4.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 8.6 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Canyon increased from \$1,965,038\* in 2004 to \$2,133,561\* in 2005, an increase of 8.6 percent. The 2004-2005 state change was 6.9 percent and the national change was 5.3 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1995 estimate of \$1,233,428\* to the 2005 estimate was 5.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.6 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
