



BEARFACTS 1995 – 2005

Slope , North Dakota [38087]

Slope is one of 53 counties in North Dakota. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2005 population of 684 ranked 53rd in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2005 Slope had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$24,640. This PCPI ranked 49th in the state and was 77 percent of the state average, \$31,871, and 71 percent of the national average, \$34,757. The 2005 PCPI reflected an increase of 11.1 percent from 2004. The 2004-2005 state change was 8.9 percent and the national change was 4.9 percent. In 1995 the PCPI of Slope was \$11,167 and ranked 50th in the state. The 1995-2005 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 8.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.4 percent and for the nation was 4.2 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2005 Slope had a total personal income (TPI) of \$16,854*. This TPI ranked 53rd in the state and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total. In 1995 the TPI of Slope was \$8,710* and ranked 53rd in the state. The 2005 TPI reflected an increase of 9.6 percent from 2004. The 2004-2005 state change was 8.7 percent and the national change was 5.9 percent. The 1995-2005 average annual growth rate of TPI was 6.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.2 percent and for the nation was 5.3 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Slope. In 2005 net earnings accounted for 61.7 percent of TPI (compared with 37.4 in 1995); dividends, interest, and rent were 21.0 percent (compared with 39.9 in 1995); and personal current transfer receipts were 17.3 percent (compared with 22.8 in 1995). From 2004 to 2005 net earnings increased 17.0 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 2.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 1.6 percent. From 1995 to 2005 net earnings increased on average 12.3 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 0.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 3.9 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Slope increased from \$8,766* in 2004 to \$10,082* in 2005, an increase of 15.0 percent. The 2004-2005 state change was 8.3 percent and the national change was 5.4 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1995 estimate of \$3,035* to the 2005 estimate was 12.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.7 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
