



## **BEARFACTS 1995 – 2005**

### **Bryan , Oklahoma [40013]**

Bryan is one of 77 counties in Oklahoma. It is part of the Durant, OK Micropolitan SA. Its 2005 population of 37,701 ranked 26th in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2005 Bryan had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$24,299. This PCPI ranked 38th in the state and was 81 percent of the state average, \$30,107, and 70 percent of the national average, \$34,757. The 2005 PCPI reflected an increase of 6.8 percent from 2004. The 2004-2005 state change was 5.8 percent and the national change was 4.9 percent. In 1995 the PCPI of Bryan was \$14,922 and ranked 49th in the state. The 1995-2005 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 5.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 4.2 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2005 Bryan had a total personal income (TPI) of \$916,087\*. This TPI ranked 24th in the state and accounted for 0.9 percent of the state total. In 1995 the TPI of Bryan was \$512,867\* and ranked 28th in the state. The 2005 TPI reflected an increase of 7.7 percent from 2004. The 2004-2005 state change was 6.4 percent and the national change was 5.9 percent. The 1995-2005 average annual growth rate of TPI was 6.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.5 percent and for the nation was 5.3 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Bryan. In 2005 net earnings accounted for 65.1 percent of TPI (compared with 60.0 in 1995); dividends, interest, and rent were 11.1 percent (compared with 15.1 in 1995); and personal current transfer receipts were 23.8 percent (compared with 25.0 in 1995). From 2004 to 2005 net earnings increased 9.9 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 0.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 5.9 percent. From 1995 to 2005 net earnings increased on average 6.9 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.5 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Bryan increased from \$517,796\* in 2004 to \$576,600\* in 2005, an increase of 11.4 percent. The 2004-2005 state change was 6.4 percent and the national change was 5.4 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1995 estimate of \$272,319\* to the 2005 estimate was 7.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.7 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
