



## **BEARFACTS 1995 – 2005**

### **Teton , Wyoming [56039]**

Teton is one of 23 counties in Wyoming. It is part of the Jackson, WY-ID Micropolitan SA. Its 2005 population of 19,327 ranked 10th in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2005 Teton had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$96,570. This PCPI ranked 1st in the state and was 259 percent of the state average, \$37,316, and 278 percent of the national average, \$34,757. The 2005 PCPI reflected an increase of 8.3 percent from 2004. The 2004-2005 state change was 5.8 percent and the national change was 4.9 percent. In 1995 the PCPI of Teton was \$45,027 and ranked 1st in the state. The 1995-2005 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 7.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.9 percent and for the nation was 4.2 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2005 Teton had a total personal income (TPI) of \$1,866,416\*. This TPI ranked 3rd in the state and accounted for 9.9 percent of the state total. In 1995 the TPI of Teton was \$671,215\* and ranked 4th in the state. The 2005 TPI reflected an increase of 8.8 percent from 2004. The 2004-2005 state change was 6.5 percent and the national change was 5.9 percent. The 1995-2005 average annual growth rate of TPI was 10.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.4 percent and for the nation was 5.3 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Teton. In 2005 net earnings accounted for 39.9 percent of TPI (compared with 56.0 in 1995); dividends, interest, and rent were 57.1 percent (compared with 39.9 in 1995); and personal current transfer receipts were 3.0 percent (compared with 4.1 in 1995). From 2004 to 2005 net earnings increased 4.1 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 12.3 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 8.8 percent. From 1995 to 2005 net earnings increased on average 7.1 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 14.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 7.6 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Teton increased from \$886,164\* in 2004 to \$927,646\* in 2005, an increase of 4.7 percent. The 2004-2005 state change was 9.3 percent and the national change was 5.4 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1995 estimate of \$465,057\* to the 2005 estimate was 7.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.3 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.

*\*Note: All income estimates with the exception of PCPI are in thousands of dollars, not adjusted for inflation.*
