



BEARFACTS 1996 – 2006

Lincoln , Kansas [20105]

Lincoln is one of 105 counties in Kansas. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2006 population of 3,276 ranked 80th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2006 Lincoln had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$21,591. This PCPI ranked 101st in the state and was 63 percent of the state average, \$34,525, and 59 percent of the national average, \$36,794. The 2006 PCPI reflected an increase of 2.8 percent from 2005. The 2005-2006 state change was 7.5 percent and the national change was 6.1 percent. In 1996 the PCPI of Lincoln was \$17,507 and ranked 96th in the state. The 1996-2006 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 2.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.2 percent and for the nation was 4.3 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2006 Lincoln had a total personal income (TPI) of \$70,732*. This TPI ranked 92nd in the state and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total. In 1996 the TPI of Lincoln was \$61,974* and ranked 94th in the state. The 2006 TPI reflected an increase of 0.1 percent from 2005. The 2005-2006 state change was 8.0 percent and the national change was 7.1 percent. The 1996-2006 average annual growth rate of TPI was 1.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Lincoln. In 2006 net earnings accounted for 52.5 percent of TPI (compared with 48.7 in 1996); dividends, interest, and rent were 20.5 percent (compared with 28.7 in 1996); and personal current transfer receipts were 26.9 percent (compared with 22.6 in 1996). From 2005 to 2006 net earnings decreased 8.4 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 15.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 8.6 percent. From 1996 to 2006 net earnings increased on average 2.1 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent decreased on average 2.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 3.1 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Lincoln decreased from \$33,179* in 2005 to \$29,444* in 2006, a decrease of 11.3 percent. The 2005-2006 state change was 6.3 percent and the national change was 5.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1996 estimate of \$26,680* to the 2006 estimate was 1.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.1 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
