



BEARFACTS 1996 – 2006

Burke , North Dakota [38013]

Burke is one of 53 counties in North Dakota. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2006 population of 1,903 ranked 48th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2006 Burke had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$30,434. This PCPI ranked 21st in the state and was 94 percent of the state average, \$32,233, and 83 percent of the national average, \$36,794. The 2006 PCPI reflected a decrease of 8.5 percent from 2005. The 2005-2006 state change was 2.1 percent and the national change was 6.1 percent. In 1996 the PCPI of Burke was \$23,944 and ranked 7th in the state. The 1996-2006 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 2.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.3 percent and for the nation was 4.3 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2006 Burke had a total personal income (TPI) of \$57,915*. This TPI ranked 44th in the state and accounted for 0.3 percent of the state total. In 1996 the TPI of Burke was \$59,668* and ranked 40th in the state. The 2006 TPI reflected a decrease of 11.5 percent from 2005. The 2005-2006 state change was 2.3 percent and the national change was 7.1 percent. The 1996-2006 average annual growth rate of TPI was - 0.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.1 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Burke. In 2006 net earnings accounted for 60.8 percent of TPI (compared with 58.0 in 1996); dividends, interest, and rent were 16.1 percent (compared with 23.8 in 1996); and personal current transfer receipts were 23.1 percent (compared with 18.2 in 1996). From 2005 to 2006 net earnings decreased 16.7 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 9.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 4.7 percent. From 1996 to 2006 net earnings increased on average 0.2 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent decreased on average 4.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 2.1 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Burke decreased from \$46,634* in 2005 to \$39,350* in 2006, a decrease of 15.6 percent. The 2005-2006 state change was 1.5 percent and the national change was 5.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1996 estimate of \$36,837* to the 2006 estimate was 0.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.5 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
