



## **BEARFACTS 1996 – 2006**

### **Baylor , Texas [48023]**

Baylor is one of 254 counties in Texas. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2006 population of 3,818 ranked 212th in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2006 Baylor had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$23,078. This PCPI ranked 202nd in the state and was 66 percent of the state average, \$35,162, and 63 percent of the national average, \$36,794. The 2006 PCPI reflected a decrease of 2.0 percent from 2005. The 2005-2006 state change was 5.8 percent and the national change was 6.1 percent. In 1996 the PCPI of Baylor was \$16,784 and ranked 156th in the state. The 1996-2006 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.7 percent and for the nation was 4.3 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2006 Baylor had a total personal income (TPI) of \$88,111\*. This TPI ranked 218th in the state and accounted for 0.0 percent of the state total. In 1996 the TPI of Baylor was \$70,780\* and ranked 209th in the state. The 2006 TPI reflected a decrease of 2.9 percent from 2005. The 2005-2006 state change was 8.3 percent and the national change was 7.1 percent. The 1996-2006 average annual growth rate of TPI was 2.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.7 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Baylor. In 2006 net earnings accounted for 49.8 percent of TPI (compared with 44.4 in 1996); dividends, interest, and rent were 15.0 percent (compared with 24.5 in 1996); and personal current transfer receipts were 35.2 percent (compared with 31.1 in 1996). From 2005 to 2006 net earnings decreased 6.2 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 11.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 6.5 percent. From 1996 to 2006 net earnings increased on average 3.4 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent decreased on average 2.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 3.5 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Baylor decreased from \$45,592\* in 2005 to \$42,448\* in 2006, a decrease of 6.9 percent. The 2005-2006 state change was 8.7 percent and the national change was 5.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1996 estimate of \$32,120\* to the 2006 estimate was 2.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.1 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
