



BEARFACTS 1996 – 2006

Tupelo (BEA-EA) [57171]

Tupelo is one of 179 BEA Economic Areas in the nation. Its 2006 population of 535,100 ranked 111th in the nation.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2006 Tupelo had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$25,099. This PCPI ranked 175th in the United States and was 68 percent of the national average, \$36,794. The 2006 PCPI reflected an increase of 3.8 percent from 2005. The 2005-2006 national change was 6.1 percent. In 1996 the PCPI of Tupelo was \$16,988 and ranked 176th in the United States. The 1996-2006 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.3 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2006 Tupelo had a total personal income (TPI) of \$13,430,408*. This TPI ranked 126th in the United States. In 1996 the TPI of Tupelo was \$8,801,736* and ranked 121st in the United States. The 2006 TPI reflected an increase of 4.4 percent from 2005. The 2005-2006 national change was 7.1 percent. The 1996-2006 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.4 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Tupelo. In 2006 net earnings accounted for 61.4 percent of TPI (compared with 64.7 in 1996); dividends, interest, and rent were 14.0 percent (compared with 14.9 in 1996); and personal current transfer receipts were 24.6 percent (compared with 20.3 in 1996). From 2005 to 2006 net earnings increased 2.0 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 11.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 7.0 percent. From 1996 to 2006 net earnings increased on average 3.8 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.3 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Tupelo increased from \$9,019,593* in 2005 to \$9,216,296* in 2006, an increase of 2.2 percent. The 2005-2006 national change was 5.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1996 estimate of \$6,410,363* to the 2006 estimate was 3.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.5 percent.
