



BEARFACTS 1997 – 2007

Harlan , Nebraska [31083]

Harlan is one of 93 counties in Nebraska. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2007 population of 3,391 ranked 65th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2007 Harlan had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$27,667. This PCPI ranked 69th in the state and was 76 percent of the state average, \$36,372, and 72 percent of the national average, \$38,615. The 2007 PCPI reflected an increase of 7.7 percent from 2006. The 2006-2007 state change was 6.8 percent and the national change was 4.9 percent. In 1997 the PCPI of Harlan was \$19,526 and ranked 61st in the state. The 1997-2007 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.2 percent and for the nation was 4.3 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2007 Harlan had a total personal income (TPI) of \$93,820*. This TPI ranked 66th in the state and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total. In 1997 the TPI of Harlan was \$75,762* and ranked 66th in the state. The 2007 TPI reflected an increase of 7.3 percent from 2006. The 2006-2007 state change was 7.4 percent and the national change was 6.0 percent. The 1997-2007 average annual growth rate of TPI was 2.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.7 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Harlan. In 2007 net earnings accounted for 60.8 percent of TPI (compared with 56.4 in 1997); dividends, interest, and rent were 14.0 percent (compared with 23.4 in 1997); and personal current transfer receipts were 25.3 percent (compared with 20.1 in 1997). From 2006 to 2007 net earnings increased 10.1 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 4.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 2.8 percent. From 1997 to 2007 net earnings increased on average 2.9 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent decreased on average 3.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.5 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Harlan increased from \$41,401* in 2006 to \$45,877* in 2007, an increase of 10.8 percent. The 2006-2007 state change was 6.8 percent and the national change was 4.9 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1997 estimate of \$38,751* to the 2007 estimate was 1.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.
