



State BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001

North Dakota

The population of North Dakota in 2001 was 636,211. Its rank was 47th in the nation.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 North Dakota had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$25,880. This PCPI ranked 39th in the United States and was 85 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 3.1 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of North Dakota was \$16,282 and ranked 41st in the United States. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 North Dakota had a total personal income (TPI) of \$16,465,318*. This TPI ranked 49th in the United States. In 1991 the TPI of North Dakota was \$10,351,084* and ranked 48th in the United States. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 2.3 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and total personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of North Dakota. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 64.3 percent of TPI (compared with 62.8 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 20.4 percent (compared with 21.7 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 15.4 percent (compared with 15.5 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings increased 1.8 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 3.3 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 2.8 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 5.0 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 4.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.7 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in North Dakota increased from \$12,321,985* in 2000 to \$12,601,176* in 2001, an increase of 2.3 percent. The 2000-2001 national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$7,684,660* to the 2001 estimate was 5.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.8 percent.
