



## **BEARFACTS 1989 – 1999**

### **Dodge , Georgia [13091]**

Dodge is one of 159 counties in Georgia. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 1999 population of 19,139 ranked 86th in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 1999 Dodge had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$17,231. This PCPI ranked 139th in the state and was 65 percent of the state average, \$26,359, and 62 percent of the national average, \$27,939. The 1999 PCPI reflected an increase of 4.0 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 4.3 percent and the national change was 3.9 percent. In 1989 the PCPI of Dodge was \$11,270 and ranked 137th in the state. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.7 percent and for the nation was 4.2 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 1999 Dodge had a total personal income (TPI) of \$329,782\*. This TPI ranked 92nd in the state and accounted for 0.2 percent of the state total. In 1989 the TPI of Dodge was \$197,641\* and ranked 85th in the state. The 1999 TPI reflected an increase of 4.6 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 6.7 percent and the national change was 5.1 percent. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of TPI was 5.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.1 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Dodge. In 1999 net earnings accounted for 59.0 percent of TPI (compared with 59.6 in 1989); dividends, interest, and rent were 18.1 percent (compared with 19.7 in 1989); and personal current transfer receipts were 22.9 percent (compared with 20.7 in 1989). From 1998 to 1999 net earnings increased 5.5 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 0.3 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 6.2 percent. From 1989 to 1999 net earnings increased on average 5.1 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 4.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.3 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Dodge increased from \$165,263\* in 1998 to \$172,617\* in 1999, an increase of 4.4 percent. The 1998-1999 state change was 8.6 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1989 estimate of \$96,419\* to the 1999 estimate was 6.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.2 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.
