



## **BEARFACTS 1989 – 1999**

### **Montgomery , Illinois [17135]**

Montgomery is one of 102 counties in Illinois. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 1999 population of 30,748 ranked 50th in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 1999 Montgomery had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$20,626. This PCPI ranked 75th in the state and was 68 percent of the state average, \$30,212, and 74 percent of the national average, \$27,939. The 1999 PCPI reflected an increase of 1.8 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 3.0 percent and the national change was 3.9 percent. In 1989 the PCPI of Montgomery was \$14,358 and ranked 74th in the state. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.3 percent and for the nation was 4.2 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 1999 Montgomery had a total personal income (TPI) of \$634,200\*. This TPI ranked 51st in the state and accounted for 0.2 percent of the state total. In 1989 the TPI of Montgomery was \$446,137\* and ranked 49th in the state. The 1999 TPI reflected an increase of 0.8 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 3.7 percent and the national change was 5.1 percent. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of TPI was 3.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.2 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Montgomery. In 1999 net earnings accounted for 57.2 percent of TPI (compared with 57.4 in 1989); dividends, interest, and rent were 22.6 percent (compared with 24.6 in 1989); and personal current transfer receipts were 20.1 percent (compared with 18.0 in 1989). From 1998 to 1999 net earnings increased 3.1 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 4.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 0.3 percent. From 1989 to 1999 net earnings increased on average 3.6 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.7 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Montgomery increased from \$357,026\* in 1998 to \$367,990\* in 1999, an increase of 3.1 percent. The 1998-1999 state change was 5.7 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1989 estimate of \$259,710\* to the 1999 estimate was 3.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.3 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.
