



BEARFACTS 1989 – 1999

Ohio , Kentucky [21183]

Ohio is one of 120 counties in Kentucky. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 1999 population of 22,800 ranked 49th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 1999 Ohio had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$17,102. This PCPI ranked 80th in the state and was 75 percent of the state average, \$22,763, and 61 percent of the national average, \$27,939. The 1999 PCPI reflected a decrease of 5.0 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 3.3 percent and the national change was 3.9 percent. In 1989 the PCPI of Ohio was \$11,114 and ranked 78th in the state. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.5 percent and for the nation was 4.2 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 1999 Ohio had a total personal income (TPI) of \$389,928*. This TPI ranked 53rd in the state and accounted for 0.4 percent of the state total. In 1989 the TPI of Ohio was \$235,671* and ranked 50th in the state. The 1999 TPI reflected a decrease of 4.1 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 4.1 percent and the national change was 5.1 percent. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of TPI was 5.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.5 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Ohio. In 1999 net earnings accounted for 59.6 percent of TPI (compared with 59.9 in 1989); dividends, interest, and rent were 15.4 percent (compared with 17.6 in 1989); and personal current transfer receipts were 25.0 percent (compared with 22.6 in 1989). From 1998 to 1999 net earnings decreased 7.0 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 4.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 4.3 percent. From 1989 to 1999 net earnings increased on average 5.1 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.3 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Ohio decreased from \$202,845* in 1998 to \$176,681* in 1999, a decrease of 12.9 percent. The 1998-1999 state change was 6.1 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1989 estimate of \$119,791* to the 1999 estimate was 4.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.5 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.
