



BEARFACTS 1989 – 1999

Treasure , Montana [30103]

Treasure is one of 56 counties in Montana. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 1999 population of 868 ranked 55th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 1999 Treasure had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$16,999. This PCPI ranked 47th in the state and was 79 percent of the state average, \$21,585, and 61 percent of the national average, \$27,939. The 1999 PCPI reflected an increase of 10.2 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 2.2 percent and the national change was 3.9 percent. In 1989 the PCPI of Treasure was \$13,110 and ranked 36th in the state. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 2.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.0 percent and for the nation was 4.2 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 1999 Treasure had a total personal income (TPI) of \$14,755*. This TPI ranked 55th in the state and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total. In 1989 the TPI of Treasure was \$11,851* and ranked 55th in the state. The 1999 TPI reflected an increase of 7.3 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 2.7 percent and the national change was 5.1 percent. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of TPI was 2.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.2 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Treasure. In 1999 net earnings accounted for 49.9 percent of TPI (compared with 51.7 in 1989); dividends, interest, and rent were 30.3 percent (compared with 33.9 in 1989); and personal current transfer receipts were 19.8 percent (compared with 14.4 in 1989). From 1998 to 1999 net earnings increased 14.5 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 2.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts decreased 1.4 percent. From 1989 to 1999 net earnings increased on average 1.9 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 1.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.5 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Treasure increased from \$6,845* in 1998 to \$7,864* in 1999, an increase of 14.9 percent. The 1998-1999 state change was 4.9 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1989 estimate of \$6,075* to the 1999 estimate was 2.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.3 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.
