



BEARFACTS 1989 – 1999

Loup , Nebraska [31115]

Loup is one of 93 counties in Nebraska. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 1999 population of 712 ranked 90th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 1999 Loup had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$8,170. This PCPI ranked 93rd in the state and was 31 percent of the state average, \$26,465, and 29 percent of the national average, \$27,939. The 1999 PCPI reflected an increase of 5.3 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 3.6 percent and the national change was 3.9 percent. In 1989 the PCPI of Loup was \$9,183 and ranked 93rd in the state. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of PCPI was - 1.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.6 percent and for the nation was 4.2 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 1999 Loup had a total personal income (TPI) of \$5,817*. This TPI ranked 92nd in the state and accounted for 0.0 percent of the state total. In 1989 the TPI of Loup was \$6,465* and ranked 92nd in the state. The 1999 TPI reflected an increase of 3.6 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 4.2 percent and the national change was 5.1 percent. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of TPI was - 1.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.5 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Loup. In 1999 net earnings accounted for 1.1 percent of TPI (compared with 36.9 in 1989); dividends, interest, and rent were 59.9 percent (compared with 45.4 in 1989); and personal current transfer receipts were 39.0 percent (compared with 17.7 in 1989). From 1998 to 1999 net earnings increased 244.4 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 2.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 3.8 percent. From 1989 to 1999 net earnings decreased on average 30.6 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 1.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 7.1 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Loup decreased from \$- 777* in 1998 to \$- 822* in 1999. The 1998-1999 state change was 5.1 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1989 estimate of \$2,140* to the 1999 estimate cannot be calculated. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.5 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.
