



## **BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000**

### **Bryan , Georgia [13029]**

Bryan is one of 159 counties in Georgia. It is part of the [Savannah, GA \(MSA\)](#). Its 2000 population of 23,510 ranked 69th in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Bryan had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$24,104. This PCPI ranked 26th in the state and was 86 percent of the state average, \$27,990, and 81 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 6.1 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 6.2 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Bryan was \$14,996 and ranked 34th in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.7 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Bryan had a total personal income (TPI) of \$566,688\*. This TPI ranked 57th in the state and accounted for 0.2 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Bryan was \$234,590\* and ranked 78th in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 7.7 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 8.6 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 9.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.2 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Bryan. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 74.5 percent of TPI (compared with 77.3 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 13.5 percent (compared with 10.8 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 12.1 percent (compared with 11.9 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings increased 6.4 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 14.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 9.2 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 8.8 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 11.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 9.3 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Bryan increased from \$140,902\* in 1999 to \$154,618\* in 2000, an increase of 9.7 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 8.1 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$66,006\* to the 2000 estimate was 8.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.4 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
