



BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000

Clark , Kansas [20025]

Clark is one of 105 counties in Kansas. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2000 population of 2,387 ranked 100th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Clark had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$22,451. This PCPI ranked 54th in the state and was 81 percent of the state average, \$27,693, and 75 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected a decrease of 7.2 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 5.7 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Clark was \$21,128 and ranked 10th in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 0.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.4 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Clark had a total personal income (TPI) of \$53,591*. This TPI ranked 101st in the state and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Clark was \$51,130* and ranked 97th in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected a decrease of 8.2 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 6.3 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 0.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.2 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Clark. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 49.1 percent of TPI (compared with 58.0 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 30.4 percent (compared with 25.8 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 20.5 percent (compared with 16.2 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings decreased 15.4 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 3.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 5.1 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings decreased on average 1.2 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 2.9 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Clark decreased from \$31,920* in 1999 to \$27,459* in 2000, a decrease of 14.0 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 5.1 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$28,342* to the 2000 estimate was - 0.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.4 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
