



BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000

Scott , Kansas [20171]

Scott is one of 105 counties in Kansas. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2000 population of 5,096 ranked 71st in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Scott had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$27,083. This PCPI ranked 8th in the state and was 98 percent of the state average, \$27,693, and 91 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected a decrease of 9.2 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 5.7 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Scott was \$21,336 and ranked 8th in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 2.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.4 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Scott had a total personal income (TPI) of \$138,016*. This TPI ranked 64th in the state and accounted for 0.2 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Scott was \$112,505* and ranked 57th in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected a decrease of 10.0 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 6.3 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 2.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.2 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Scott. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 63.4 percent of TPI (compared with 68.0 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 24.6 percent (compared with 21.0 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 12.0 percent (compared with 11.0 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings decreased 18.9 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 13.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 7.8 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 1.3 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 3.0 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Scott decreased from \$109,146* in 1999 to \$88,583* in 2000, a decrease of 18.8 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 5.1 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$80,463* to the 2000 estimate was 1.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.4 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
