



BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000

Carter , Kentucky [21043]

Carter is one of 120 counties in Kentucky. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2000 population of 26,876 ranked 39th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Carter had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$16,746. This PCPI ranked 97th in the state and was 69 percent of the state average, \$24,413, and 56 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 10.1 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 7.2 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Carter was \$10,892 and ranked 90th in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.7 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Carter had a total personal income (TPI) of \$450,059*. This TPI ranked 47th in the state and accounted for 0.5 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Carter was \$265,646* and ranked 48th in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 10.1 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 8.1 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 5.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.7 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Carter. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 60.3 percent of TPI (compared with 64.4 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 12.4 percent (compared with 11.8 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 27.3 percent (compared with 23.8 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings increased 11.3 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 13.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 6.1 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 4.7 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 5.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.9 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Carter increased from \$159,449* in 1999 to \$173,786* in 2000, an increase of 9.0 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 7.0 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$104,207* to the 2000 estimate was 5.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.7 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
