



BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000

Cumberland , Kentucky [21057]

Cumberland is one of 120 counties in Kentucky. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2000 population of 7,163 ranked 112th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Cumberland had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$16,969. This PCPI ranked 96th in the state and was 70 percent of the state average, \$24,413, and 57 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 12.6 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 7.2 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Cumberland was \$9,952 and ranked 103rd in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 5.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.7 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Cumberland had a total personal income (TPI) of \$121,549*. This TPI ranked 113th in the state and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Cumberland was \$67,455* and ranked 113th in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 13.8 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 8.1 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 6.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.7 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Cumberland. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 49.1 percent of TPI (compared with 50.1 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 14.4 percent (compared with 17.1 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 36.5 percent (compared with 32.8 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings increased 16.6 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 18.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 8.4 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 5.8 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 4.3 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 7.2 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Cumberland increased from \$49,050* in 1999 to \$56,558* in 2000, an increase of 15.3 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 7.0 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$35,587* to the 2000 estimate was 4.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.7 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
