



BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000

Scotland , Missouri [29199]

Scotland is one of 115 counties in Missouri. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2000 population of 4,976 ranked 111th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Scotland had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$19,744. This PCPI ranked 73rd in the state and was 72 percent of the state average, \$27,243, and 66 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 9.8 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 6.0 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Scotland was \$13,053 and ranked 63rd in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.4 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Scotland had a total personal income (TPI) of \$98,247*. This TPI ranked 110th in the state and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Scotland was \$62,930* and ranked 109th in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 9.8 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 6.9 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.4 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Scotland. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 54.6 percent of TPI (compared with 49.8 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 22.7 percent (compared with 28.5 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 22.7 percent (compared with 21.8 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings increased 16.0 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 3.3 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 3.1 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 5.5 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.0 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Scotland increased from \$42,539* in 1999 to \$49,553* in 2000, an increase of 16.5 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 6.3 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$30,656* to the 2000 estimate was 4.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.4 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
