



BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000

Glacier , Montana [30035]

Glacier is one of 56 counties in Montana. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2000 population of 13,197 ranked 13th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Glacier had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$16,393. This PCPI ranked 51st in the state and was 71 percent of the state average, \$22,934, and 55 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 8.7 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 6.2 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Glacier was \$11,267 and ranked 54th in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.0 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Glacier had a total personal income (TPI) of \$216,332*. This TPI ranked 17th in the state and accounted for 1.0 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Glacier was \$136,988* and ranked 17th in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 8.0 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 6.9 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.3 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Glacier. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 55.9 percent of TPI (compared with 59.2 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 15.8 percent (compared with 19.6 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 28.3 percent (compared with 21.3 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings increased 2.0 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 2.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 27.2 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 4.1 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 7.7 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Glacier increased from \$146,174* in 1999 to \$149,224* in 2000, an increase of 2.1 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 5.6 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$101,663* to the 2000 estimate was 3.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.4 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
