



BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000

Hooker , Nebraska [31091]

Hooker is one of 93 counties in Nebraska. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2000 population of 782 ranked 86th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Hooker had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$13,188. This PCPI ranked 87th in the state and was 48 percent of the state average, \$27,626, and 44 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected a decrease of 9.0 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 4.4 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Hooker was \$13,795 and ranked 85th in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was - 0.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.4 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Hooker had a total personal income (TPI) of \$10,313*. This TPI ranked 88th in the state and accounted for 0.0 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Hooker was \$11,022* and ranked 87th in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected a decrease of 8.7 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 4.9 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was - 0.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.2 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Hooker. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 7.8 percent of TPI (compared with 39.9 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 52.9 percent (compared with 36.0 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 39.3 percent (compared with 24.2 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings decreased 62.4 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 1.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 6.9 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings decreased on average 15.7 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.3 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Hooker decreased from \$3,536* in 1999 to \$2,061* in 2000, a decrease of 41.7 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 3.8 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$5,779* to the 2000 estimate was - 9.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.1 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
