



BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000

York , Nebraska [31185]

York is one of 93 counties in Nebraska. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2000 population of 14,571 ranked 20th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 York had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$25,425. This PCPI ranked 15th in the state and was 92 percent of the state average, \$27,626, and 85 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 1.8 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 4.4 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of York was \$17,985 and ranked 20th in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.4 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 York had a total personal income (TPI) of \$370,469*. This TPI ranked 19th in the state and accounted for 0.8 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of York was \$259,355* and ranked 17th in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 1.1 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 4.9 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 3.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.2 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of York. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 61.7 percent of TPI (compared with 65.5 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 23.7 percent (compared with 22.6 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 14.6 percent (compared with 11.9 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings decreased 1.8 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 6.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 5.2 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 3.0 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 4.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.8 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in York decreased from \$290,921* in 1999 to \$283,956* in 2000, a decrease of 2.4 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 3.8 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$195,251* to the 2000 estimate was 3.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.1 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
