



BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000

Nye , Nevada [32023]

Nye is one of 17 counties in Nevada. It is part of the Pahrump, NV Micropolitan SA. Its 2000 population of 33,117 ranked 7th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Nye had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$24,059. This PCPI ranked 13th in the state and was 79 percent of the state average, \$30,436, and 81 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 6.3 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 4.3 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Nye was \$16,365 and ranked 14th in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.1 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Nye had a total personal income (TPI) of \$796,770*. This TPI ranked 7th in the state and accounted for 1.3 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Nye was \$295,785* and ranked 7th in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 11.9 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 8.8 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 10.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 9.5 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Nye. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 60.8 percent of TPI (compared with 69.4 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 20.9 percent (compared with 18.0 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 18.3 percent (compared with 12.5 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings increased 10.8 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 15.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 11.7 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 9.0 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 12.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 14.7 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Nye increased from \$435,975* in 1999 to \$464,195* in 2000, an increase of 6.5 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 7.1 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$449,919* to the 2000 estimate was 0.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 9.1 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
