



BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000

Cotton , Oklahoma [40033]

Cotton is one of 77 counties in Oklahoma. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2000 population of 6,629 ranked 66th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Cotton had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$20,698. This PCPI ranked 30th in the state and was 85 percent of the state average, \$24,410, and 69 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 2.7 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 8.2 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Cotton was \$15,225 and ranked 20th in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.2 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Cotton had a total personal income (TPI) of \$137,209*. This TPI ranked 65th in the state and accounted for 0.2 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Cotton was \$101,080* and ranked 66th in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 5.1 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 8.7 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.2 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Cotton. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 64.9 percent of TPI (compared with 64.3 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 16.9 percent (compared with 18.0 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 18.2 percent (compared with 17.7 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings increased 4.3 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 13.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 1.2 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 3.2 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 3.4 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Cotton decreased from \$46,868* in 1999 to \$46,590* in 2000, a decrease of 0.6 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 7.8 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$44,372* to the 2000 estimate was 0.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.1 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
