



BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000

Texas , Oklahoma [40139]

Texas is one of 77 counties in Oklahoma. It is part of the Guymon, OK Micropolitan SA. Its 2000 population of 20,182 ranked 39th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Texas had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$28,239. This PCPI ranked 3rd in the state and was 116 percent of the state average, \$24,410, and 95 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected a decrease of 1.9 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 8.2 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Texas was \$15,485 and ranked 18th in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 6.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.2 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Texas had a total personal income (TPI) of \$569,919*. This TPI ranked 34th in the state and accounted for 0.7 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Texas was \$254,876* and ranked 39th in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected a decrease of 0.4 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 8.7 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 8.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.2 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Texas. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 77.2 percent of TPI (compared with 66.6 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 13.2 percent (compared with 21.1 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 9.5 percent (compared with 12.3 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings decreased 2.5 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 9.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 4.9 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 10.0 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.6 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Texas decreased from \$476,085* in 1999 to \$470,674* in 2000, a decrease of 1.1 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 7.8 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$164,691* to the 2000 estimate was 11.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.1 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
