



## **BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000**

### **Hyde , South Dakota [46069]**

Hyde is one of 66 counties in South Dakota. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2000 population of 1,666 ranked 63rd in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Hyde had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$22,393. This PCPI ranked 41st in the state and was 87 percent of the state average, \$25,723, and 75 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected a decrease of 4.2 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 5.1 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Hyde was \$16,554 and ranked 22nd in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Hyde had a total personal income (TPI) of \$37,307\*. This TPI ranked 61st in the state and accounted for 0.2 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Hyde was \$27,976\* and ranked 60th in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected a decrease of 4.4 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 5.8 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 2.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.6 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Hyde. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 50.3 percent of TPI (compared with 54.3 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 31.6 percent (compared with 30.0 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 18.1 percent (compared with 15.7 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings decreased 11.1 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 2.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 5.5 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 2.1 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.4 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Hyde decreased from \$23,462\* in 1999 to \$21,935\* in 2000, a decrease of 6.5 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 5.3 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$16,328\* to the 2000 estimate was 3.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.8 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
