



BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000

Lyman , South Dakota [46085]

Lyman is one of 66 counties in South Dakota. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2000 population of 3,908 ranked 43rd in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Lyman had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$20,613. This PCPI ranked 55th in the state and was 80 percent of the state average, \$25,723, and 69 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected a decrease of 3.8 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 5.1 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Lyman was \$15,693 and ranked 32nd in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 2.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Lyman had a total personal income (TPI) of \$80,557*. This TPI ranked 45th in the state and accounted for 0.4 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Lyman was \$57,217* and ranked 43rd in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected a decrease of 2.3 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 5.8 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 3.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.6 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Lyman. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 55.4 percent of TPI (compared with 61.4 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 25.0 percent (compared with 24.1 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 19.5 percent (compared with 14.5 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings decreased 8.0 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 1.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 11.7 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 2.4 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.6 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Lyman decreased from \$48,479* in 1999 to \$44,689* in 2000, a decrease of 7.8 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 5.3 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$33,250* to the 2000 estimate was 3.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.8 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
