



BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000

Dallas , Texas [48113]

Dallas is one of 254 counties in Texas. It is part of the [Dallas-Fort Worth-Arlington, TX \(MSA\)](#). Its 2000 population of 2,225,448 ranked 2nd in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Dallas had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$36,045. This PCPI ranked 5th in the state and was 127 percent of the state average, \$28,317, and 121 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 10.6 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 7.9 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Dallas was \$22,664 and ranked 7th in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.0 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Dallas had a total personal income (TPI) of \$80,217,322*. This TPI ranked 2nd in the state and accounted for 13.5 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Dallas was \$42,235,901* and ranked 2nd in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 12.0 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 9.9 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 6.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.2 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Dallas. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 78.5 percent of TPI (compared with 74.2 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 14.2 percent (compared with 18.9 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 7.3 percent (compared with 6.9 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings increased 13.1 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 9.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 6.2 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 7.2 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 7.1 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Dallas increased from \$89,994,597* in 1999 to \$101,445,265* in 2000, an increase of 12.7 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 9.9 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$45,676,367* to the 2000 estimate was 8.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.6 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
