



## **BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000**

### **Juab , Utah [49023]**

Juab is one of 29 counties in Utah. It is part of the [Provo-Orem, UT \(MSA\)](#). Its 2000 population of 8,271 ranked 21st in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Juab had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$18,055. This PCPI ranked 20th in the state and was 76 percent of the state average, \$23,866, and 60 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 4.2 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 6.6 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Juab was \$11,685 and ranked 24th in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Juab had a total personal income (TPI) of \$149,329\*. This TPI ranked 22nd in the state and accounted for 0.3 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Juab was \$68,005\* and ranked 22nd in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 6.8 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 8.5 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 8.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.6 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Juab. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 69.2 percent of TPI (compared with 63.0 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 14.0 percent (compared with 17.7 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 16.8 percent (compared with 19.4 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings increased 6.5 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 10.3 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 4.9 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 9.2 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 5.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.7 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Juab increased from \$75,331\* in 1999 to \$80,459\* in 2000, an increase of 6.8 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 7.8 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$37,746\* to the 2000 estimate was 7.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.9 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
