



## **BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000**

### **Big Horn , Wyoming [56003]**

Big Horn is one of 23 counties in Wyoming. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2000 population of 11,411 ranked 15th in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Big Horn had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$20,661. This PCPI ranked 23rd in the state and was 73 percent of the state average, \$28,470, and 69 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 3.7 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 7.3 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Big Horn was \$14,229 and ranked 22nd in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.7 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Big Horn had a total personal income (TPI) of \$235,766\*. This TPI ranked 15th in the state and accounted for 1.7 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Big Horn was \$149,218\* and ranked 15th in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 3.0 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 7.8 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.6 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Big Horn. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 60.3 percent of TPI (compared with 60.2 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 22.0 percent (compared with 21.6 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 17.8 percent (compared with 18.2 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings increased 3.7 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 2.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 2.1 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 4.7 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 4.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.5 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Big Horn increased from \$159,704\* in 1999 to \$166,333\* in 2000, an increase of 4.2 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 7.4 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$101,592\* to the 2000 estimate was 5.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.

*\*Note: All income estimates with the exception of PCPI are in thousands of dollars, not adjusted for inflation.*
