



## **BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000**

### **Cincinnati-Middletown-Wilmington (BEA-EA) [57033]**

Cincinnati-Middletown-Wilmington is one of 179 BEA Economic Areas in the nation. Its 2000 population of 2,214,712 ranked 32nd in the nation.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Cincinnati-Middletown-Wilmington had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$29,655. This PCPI ranked 24th in the United States and was 99 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 5.0 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Cincinnati-Middletown-Wilmington was \$19,081 and ranked 28th in the United States. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.4 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Cincinnati-Middletown-Wilmington had a total personal income (TPI) of \$65,677,206\*. This TPI ranked 32nd in the United States. In 1990 the TPI of Cincinnati-Middletown-Wilmington was \$38,737,930\* and ranked 28th in the United States. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 5.8 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 5.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.6 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Cincinnati-Middletown-Wilmington. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 69.2 percent of TPI (compared with 66.6 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 18.3 percent (compared with 20.8 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 12.5 percent (compared with 12.6 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings increased 5.7 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 5.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 7.5 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 5.8 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 4.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.4 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Cincinnati-Middletown-Wilmington increased from \$47,642,323\* in 1999 to \$50,142,057\* in 2000, an increase of 5.2 percent. The 1999-2000 national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$28,549,353\* to the 2000 estimate was 5.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.8 percent.
