



## **BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000**

### **Greenville-Spartanburg-Anderson (BEA-EA) [57068]**

Greenville-Spartanburg-Anderson is one of 179 BEA Economic Areas in the nation. Its 2000 population of 1,252,433 ranked 60th in the nation.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Greenville-Spartanburg-Anderson had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$25,109. This PCPI ranked 77th in the United States and was 84 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 5.7 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Greenville-Spartanburg-Anderson was \$16,280 and ranked 91st in the United States. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.4 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Greenville-Spartanburg-Anderson had a total personal income (TPI) of \$31,447,892\*. This TPI ranked 61st in the United States. In 1990 the TPI of Greenville-Spartanburg-Anderson was \$17,705,314\* and ranked 61st in the United States. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 7.1 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 5.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.6 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Greenville-Spartanburg-Anderson. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 67.8 percent of TPI (compared with 69.6 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 17.3 percent (compared with 17.8 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 14.9 percent (compared with 12.6 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings increased 6.3 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 10.3 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 7.1 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 5.6 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 5.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 7.7 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Greenville-Spartanburg-Anderson increased from \$22,716,543\* in 1999 to \$24,095,069\* in 2000, an increase of 6.1 percent. The 1999-2000 national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$13,943,418\* to the 2000 estimate was 5.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.8 percent.
