



BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001

Boulder , Colorado [08013]

Boulder is one of 63 counties in Colorado. It is part of the [Boulder, CO \(MSA\)](#). Its 2001 population of 300,512 ranked 6th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Boulder had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$40,218. This PCPI ranked 5th in the state and was 117 percent of the state average, \$34,455, and 132 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected a decrease of 0.2 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 3.3 percent and the national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Boulder was \$22,703 and ranked 5th in the state. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 5.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.5 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Boulder had a total personal income (TPI) of \$12,085,925*. This TPI ranked 5th in the state and accounted for 7.9 percent of the state total. In 1991 the TPI of Boulder was \$5,286,351* and ranked 5th in the state. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 2.2 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 5.8 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 8.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 8.4 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Boulder. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 72.9 percent of TPI (compared with 72.3 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 21.6 percent (compared with 21.1 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 5.4 percent (compared with 6.7 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings increased 1.4 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 3.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 11.2 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 8.7 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 8.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.4 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Boulder increased from \$11,011,958* in 2000 to \$11,156,883* in 2001, an increase of 1.3 percent. The 2000-2001 state change was 5.6 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$4,094,037* to the 2001 estimate was 10.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 8.8 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
