



BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001

Washington , Iowa [19183]

Washington is one of 99 counties in Iowa. It is part of the [Iowa City, IA \(MSA\)](#). Its 2001 population of 21,005 ranked 31st in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Washington had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$26,759. This PCPI ranked 18th in the state and was 99 percent of the state average, \$27,125, and 87 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected a decrease of 1.9 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 2.1 percent and the national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Washington was \$17,550 and ranked 20th in the state. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.3 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Washington had a total personal income (TPI) of \$562,082*. This TPI ranked 28th in the state and accounted for 0.7 percent of the state total. In 1991 the TPI of Washington was \$347,959* and ranked 28th in the state. The 2001 TPI reflected a decrease of 0.4 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 2.2 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Washington. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 63.5 percent of TPI (compared with 60.2 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 20.9 percent (compared with 24.4 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 15.5 percent (compared with 15.4 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings decreased 2.9 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 1.3 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 8.1 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 5.5 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.3 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.0 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Washington decreased from \$265,662* in 2000 to \$246,633* in 2001, a decrease of 7.2 percent. The 2000-2001 state change was 1.7 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$182,067* to the 2001 estimate was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.0 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
