



BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001

Tensas , Louisiana [22107]

Tensas is one of 64 counties in Louisiana. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2001 population of 6,463 ranked 64th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Tensas had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$17,345. This PCPI ranked 59th in the state and was 70 percent of the state average, \$24,719, and 57 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected a decrease of 4.0 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 7.1 percent and the national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Tensas was \$13,165 and ranked 32nd in the state. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 2.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.5 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Tensas had a total personal income (TPI) of \$112,102*. This TPI ranked 64th in the state and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total. In 1991 the TPI of Tensas was \$91,230* and ranked 64th in the state. The 2001 TPI reflected a decrease of 5.6 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 6.9 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 2.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.0 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Tensas. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 47.9 percent of TPI (compared with 55.9 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 19.7 percent (compared with 18.4 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 32.4 percent (compared with 25.7 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings decreased 20.8 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 0.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 26.4 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 0.5 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.5 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Tensas decreased from \$69,749* in 2000 to \$53,378* in 2001, a decrease of 23.5 percent. The 2000-2001 state change was 6.6 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$49,895* to the 2001 estimate was 0.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.9 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
