



BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001

Blaine , Nebraska [31009]

Blaine is one of 93 counties in Nebraska. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2001 population of 560 ranked 91st in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Blaine had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$9,505. This PCPI ranked 92nd in the state and was 33 percent of the state average, \$28,703, and 31 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected a decrease of 1.2 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 3.9 percent and the national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Blaine was \$13,951 and ranked 82nd in the state. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was - 3.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.5 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Blaine had a total personal income (TPI) of \$5,323*. This TPI ranked 92nd in the state and accounted for 0.0 percent of the state total. In 1991 the TPI of Blaine was \$9,487* and ranked 88th in the state. The 2001 TPI reflected a decrease of 5.0 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 4.2 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was - 5.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.2 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Blaine. From 2000 to 2001 dividends, interest, and rent increased 11.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 11.4 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings cannot be calculated; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 1.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.7 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Blaine decreased from \$1,436* in 2000 to \$- 114* in 2001. The 2000-2001 state change was 4.3 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$5,470* to the 2001 estimate cannot be calculated. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.2 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.

**Note: All income estimates with the exception of PCPI are in thousands of dollars, not adjusted for inflation.*
