



BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001

Logan , North Dakota [38047]

Logan is one of 53 counties in North Dakota. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2001 population of 2,214 ranked 45th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Logan had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$26,364. This PCPI ranked 6th in the state and was 102 percent of the state average, \$25,880, and 86 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 1.0 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 3.1 percent and the national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Logan was \$14,920 and ranked 27th in the state. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 5.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.7 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Logan had a total personal income (TPI) of \$58,369*. This TPI ranked 41st in the state and accounted for 0.4 percent of the state total. In 1991 the TPI of Logan was \$41,581* and ranked 42nd in the state. The 2001 TPI reflected a decrease of 2.8 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 2.3 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 3.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Logan. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 51.9 percent of TPI (compared with 47.1 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 27.2 percent (compared with 32.4 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 20.8 percent (compared with 20.5 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings decreased 11.2 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 10.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 5.2 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 4.5 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 1.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 3.6 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Logan decreased from \$34,680* in 2000 to \$30,717* in 2001, a decrease of 11.4 percent. The 2000-2001 state change was 2.3 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$20,380* to the 2001 estimate was 4.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.1 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
