



BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001

Bryan , Oklahoma [40013]

Bryan is one of 77 counties in Oklahoma. It is part of the Durant, OK Micropolitan SA. Its 2001 population of 36,459 ranked 26th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Bryan had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$20,525. This PCPI ranked 49th in the state and was 79 percent of the state average, \$26,033, and 67 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 8.1 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 6.6 percent and the national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Bryan was \$12,721 and ranked 60th in the state. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.6 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Bryan had a total personal income (TPI) of \$748,335*. This TPI ranked 26th in the state and accounted for 0.8 percent of the state total. In 1991 the TPI of Bryan was \$411,339* and ranked 28th in the state. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 7.7 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 6.9 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 6.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.5 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Bryan. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 61.2 percent of TPI (compared with 59.5 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 14.8 percent (compared with 16.7 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 24.0 percent (compared with 23.8 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings increased 8.7 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 1.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 12.0 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 6.5 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 4.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.3 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Bryan increased from \$370,389* in 2000 to \$411,977* in 2001, an increase of 11.2 percent. The 2000-2001 state change was 7.7 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$208,392* to the 2001 estimate was 7.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.6 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
