



BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001

Elk , Pennsylvania [42047]

Elk is one of 67 counties in Pennsylvania. It is part of the St. Marys, PA Micropolitan SA. Its 2001 population of 34,760 ranked 59th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Elk had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$25,891. This PCPI ranked 21st in the state and was 85 percent of the state average, \$30,310, and 85 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 0.7 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 2.1 percent and the national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Elk was \$17,449 and ranked 28th in the state. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.1 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Elk had a total personal income (TPI) of \$899,964*. This TPI ranked 56th in the state and accounted for 0.2 percent of the state total. In 1991 the TPI of Elk was \$612,397* and ranked 54th in the state. The 2001 TPI reflected a decrease of 0.1 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 2.1 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 3.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.4 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Elk. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 60.3 percent of TPI (compared with 62.7 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 19.5 percent (compared with 19.1 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 20.2 percent (compared with 18.2 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings decreased 2.2 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 3.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 10.8 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 3.5 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 4.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.0 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Elk decreased from \$643,589* in 2000 to \$630,391* in 2001, a decrease of 2.1 percent. The 2000-2001 state change was 2.0 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$434,850* to the 2001 estimate was 3.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.5 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
