



BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001

Santa Fe (MSA) [42140]

Santa Fe is one of 363 Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs) in the nation. Its 2001 population of 131,563 ranked 272nd in the nation.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Santa Fe had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$32,065. This PCPI ranked 54th in the United States and was 105 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 8.2 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Santa Fe was \$19,934 and ranked 83rd in the United States. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Santa Fe had a total personal income (TPI) of \$4,218,619*. This TPI ranked 223rd in the United States. In 1991 the TPI of Santa Fe was \$2,043,980* and ranked 267th in the United States. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 9.7 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 7.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Santa Fe. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 62.4 percent of TPI (compared with 64.3 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 27.4 percent (compared with 26.9 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 10.2 percent (compared with 8.7 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings increased 12.9 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 2.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 11.3 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 7.2 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 7.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 9.2 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Santa Fe increased from \$2,391,604* in 2000 to \$2,720,758* in 2001, an increase of 13.8 percent. The 2000-2001 national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$1,340,891* to the 2001 estimate was 7.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.8 percent.
